IRA FISHER SHARON

Ira Sharon was born in Fountain County Indiana in 1837.

He began working as a blacksmith until he was about 21, when he moved back to Kentucky and operated a ferry and ran a farm with Joel Bonar. He fell in love with one of Joel's daughters while working with him.

He married Jane Armilda Bonar there on January 3, 1860. Right after they were married, they moved back to Fountain County Indiana.

In 1865, they returned to Kentucky to take over the old farm as Joel Bonar had died and his wife needed help running the place.

In 1890 Ira and Jane moved to Mt. Auburn, Indiana with their son George. It was here Ira died in 1920.

The children of Ira Sharon were:

WILLIAM HUGH SHARON born 1860 and died 3 days later.

JAMES ARDEN SHARON born about 1862 and died a year and a half later.

---

CHARLES JOEL SHARON born in 1864 and died in his eleventh month.

JOHN ALBERTUS SHARON born in 1867. He married Sallie M. Yelton on February 28, 1889 and after her death married Edith Davis.

Mr. Sharon was a member of the Kentucky Legislature around the years 1902 or 1901.

Operated a ferry at Menzies for many years. This ferry was known as Bonar's Ferry. On account of the booms built by the Licking River Lumber Co. of Boston, the ford was not passable much of the time, hence the ferry. When the river was low, no charge was made for ferriage: when the water was too high to ford, a charge was made. The ferry was operated with a wire cable and Mr. Sharon attended the ferry when he located there.

Mr. Sharon was born in 1837 and died in 1920. He, with his wife, who died in 1918, are buried in Walnut Grove Cemetery.

#### THE SHARON FAMILY IN KENTUCKY

This section covers the family of Hugh Sharon and Jane Barnhill. Hugh was a son of Hugh Sharron and Jane Fisher from Juniata County Pennsylvania. After the Revolution, this family went westward about 1795 to Fayette County in Kentucky.

Most of the family remained in Kentucky, but one son, Robert Sharon, continued on westward in 1831 and settled in Brown County Illinois. Another son, John Sharon, moved to Fountain County Indiana about the same time.

#### HUGH SHARRON

Hugh Sharron was born in Fermanagh Township, Juniata County Pennsylvania in 1768.

There were two young Hugh Sharrons about the same age. One would have been the son of James Sharron and the other the son of Hugh Sharron his brother. Both James and Hugh were the sons of William and Margaret Sherron.

This Hugh Sharron was the son of Hugh. James' son Hugh seems to have gone with his brother William to the Westmoreland County area in the early 1790s.

Further evidence was shown in the section covering the senior Hugh Sharron. Here I showed how he was involved with Jane Fisher and she had a child, Hugh, by him who was raised by her parents and later her brother James Fisher. Since this Hugh Sharon and Jane Barnhill named a son James Fisher Sharon, the tie-in seems right. This Hugh Sharon in this section was the son of the Hugh Sharron who was a son of William Sharron and Margaret Chambers. His mom was Jane Fisher and he and the Fisher families all came out here to Kentucky together.

At any rate, this Hugh Sharron was born in 1768 in the Lost Creek Valley of Fermanagh Township in what was to become Juniata County. He served in the Revolution in the Cumberland Militia. After the War, he returned to Lost Creek and married Jane Barnhill some time around 1790. Jane was born in Bucks County Pennsylvania in 1772, and was a daughter of Samuel Barnhill and Jane Craig from Northern Ireland.

Hugh and Jane's first two children were born in Fermanagh Township; Samuel Sharon in 1792 and

A family Bible treasured by Sharon descendants in Scott County, Ky, supports this claim.

In the Shenango valley, the popular concept has been that the name, Sharon, originated from the Plains of Sharon mentioned in the Bible. But there never had been a written record of this origination until 1930, when a United States government project group analyzed and printed a brochure on Pennsylvania place names.

A follow-up assignment was tackled by four officials of the Pennsylvania Historical Commission, who split the state into quarters and surveyed the reasons for the naming of towns in the areas. The work was so immense that it was haphazard.

The tradition that Sharon, Pa., was named for Hugh Sharon, however, has been passed down through five generations of the Sharon family in Kentucky. James Fisher Sharon, son of Hugh recorded the fact in the family Bible in the 1830's. This Bible coupled with

According to Kerr's "History of Kentucky", Charles Bonar was captured by the Indians when two years old and raised as an Indian boy in Kentucky until age 16. He returned to VA, got a little education, and then returned to Kentucky where he was a pioneer settler in Pendleton County. [There is no evidence other than tradition, but there might be some grain of truth in this story.]

Hugh Sherron inherited the family farm through the will of his father in 1752. The other sons already had their own places by that time.

Hugh later moved to Fermanagh township, Cumberland County (in what was later to become a part of Juanita County).

June 30, 1766, Hugh Sharron, now living in Lost Creek, Fermanagh township, he sold the lands in East Pennsborough which he inherited through his father's will to John Hudson. The land was 143p acres. James Sharron also signed this deed, possibly as a witness or as an administrator of his father's will of 1750. The land was along the Conodoquinet Creek and abutted the lands of Walter Buchannan on the north. This transaction is noted in the Cumberland County Deeds, Volume 1, Book B, Page 6.

Robert married Sarah Marvis, Feb. 8, 1791 and moved from Kentucky to Butler County, Ohio in 1805. On March 6, 1820 he and his family were in Marion County, IN. Their family was one of the first to settle in the area. Robert had applied for 10 - 80 acre tracts of the land opened up by the treaty between the Federal Government and the Indians of the area. There was an out break of the "plague" due to an extra heavy rainfall in the summer of 1821, and was spread by a house raising, with all of the men in the area assisting. Robert died on Sept. 9 and was buried with his son William and other plague victims in the "Plague Cemetery". This cemetery is said to have been about 150 feet southeast of Robert Barnhill's home at the time.

Ref: 1840 Census of Pensioners Revolutionary or Military Services; With the names, ages, and places of residence returned by the marshalls of the several judicial districts; under The Act for Taking the Sixth Census references Samuel as an 82 year old resident in the home of James Vance in Scott County, Kentucky.

It is believed that he moved to the area of Cumberland Co., PA. in December 1776 when he was sixteen years old. It is believed that about 1782 or 1783, Samuel traveled (with Alexander, Daniel, James, William, Robert and Jane, members of his family) down the Ohio River from Pennsylvania to the vicinity of Jefferson County, Kentucky. About 1797, Samuel with his brother Daniel moved on to the vicinity of Scott County, Kentucky.

Samuel's service in the Revolutionary War is remembered on a marker erected by the Daughters of the American Revolution erected near Scott County's original settlement Johnsons Station near Great Crossing, several miles west of Royal Spring. It is believed that Samuel arrived in Kentucky after traveling down the Ohio River on either a flatboat or canoe to the area of Limestone (Maryville), Kentucky in the early 1790's. He and two of his brothers are shown in the 1795 Census of Scott County, Kentucky. Samuel and his family settled along the banks of the South Fork of Eagle Creek in Scott County, Kentucky. Here they found fertile farmland. William Sherron lived with his parent, worked the family farm and inherited their farm in Sadsbury in 1742. He had taken out a land Warrant in Philadelphia for lands west of the Susquehanna in Pennsborough Township just before his father's death, so it appears he planned to move west. He probably remained at home as his father was sick and remained there until his death.

He seem to have left there shortly afterwards as he appears in Pennsborough township as a witness to the will of James Buchanan in March of 1746/7. Pennsboro at the time was in Lancaster County. What was to become Cumberland county in 1750 was divided into two townships, Pennsborough to the east and Hopewell to the west and from 1729 to 1750 they were included in Lancaster County.

In a 1879 HISTORY OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, by the Rev. Conway Wing, the Sherrans are listed among the first few dozen settlers of the Cumberland Valley and the lands west of the Susquehanna and into the country near Conodoquinet River.

William Sherron had obtained a warrant for his lands in Pennsborough on December 22, 1740 from the land offices in Philadelphia. This land was left in his will to his son Hugh and it remained in the Sherron family until 1766. William lived and farmed this land from the time he arrived in Cumberland until his death in March of 1751/2.

William Sherron may well have been married twice. His will mentions his the living wife, Margaret Sherron. In addition it refers to his three youngest children borne by her. This may simply have been a reference to the fact these were quite young, or it may have meant that the older children were borne by a wife of previous marriage. There are very few records of wives dying, unless they survived their husbands and left wills of their own. The question as to whether or not William had one or two wives cannot be answered. Life on the frontier was quite hard and it was very common for widowers to remarry soon after the death of wives as a strong female was an essential part of family life in those days.

#### The Will of William Sherron 1750

The following Will was obtained from the Cumberland County, Pennsylvania Historical Archives in the Cumberland Count Will Book A, Pages 12and 13.

William could not write and so signed this will and the annexed codicil with a 'W' as his mark, his wife, Margaret, signed with a 'P' which is assumed for Peggy as she must have been called.

IN THE NAME OF GOD Amen the Seventh day of November 1750. I William Sherron in the Township of East Pennsborough and County of Cumberland Yeoman being very Sick and Weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be Given unto Almighty God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing tat it is appointed for all men one to die, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian Like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God and as touching Such Worldly Estate therewith God hath been Pleased to bless me in this life I give Pledge and Dispose of the Same in the following Manner and form, In primus it is my wish and I do order that in the first place all of my Just Debts and funeral charges by paid and satisfied.

ITEM and Bequeath to Margaret my Dearly Wife a third of all my Movable Goods and Chattles and a Chest and the Best table we have and the best iron pot except the largest we have and her Spinning Wheel she having given her comfort, that my Place and Improvements should be willed to my three Youngest Children born by her.

ITEM. I give and Bequeath to my Eldest Daughter Isabel Twenty Shillings.

ITEM. I give and Bequeath to William Calhoun my grandson Twenty Shillings.

ITEM: I give and Bequeath to my daughter Ann Six Pounds. and what remains of my Movable Effects Goods and Chattles I order Will and Devise to be Equally Divided amongst my four children after named Vizh: James and William and Ann and Marget. Provided that James my Eldest Son must allow Eleven Pounds current money of Pennsylvania which he has already Received to be subtracted from his share and give a discharge for the farme as a part of the Legacy Mentioned to him above.

ITEM: I order and devise that Marget my daughter shall have besides her maintenance till she be twelve years of Age and he Schooling, Twenty Pounds paid unto her when Eighteen Years of Age the same to be levied of my place and improvements and paid by Son Hugh.

Item: Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth shall have besides her Maintenance and schooling till she be Twelve Years, the Sum of Twenty Pounds Paid unto her when Eighteen Years of age the Same to be levied of my Place and Improvements and paid by my son Hugh.

Item: I give and Bequeath to my son Hugh, He paying out of the Same as ordered above, the Whole of my Place and Improvements with all Appertenances thereunto Belonging if he lives to be One and Twenty Year of Age and if he dies under age I order and will that his Mother and Two Youngest Sisters shall be equally his heirs and if it be so ordered that any of the two girls Viz. Margret and Elizabeth die under age, I allow Hugh and the other to be Equally her heir and I do Constitute Make and Assign Margret my Beloved Wife and James Sherran my Eldest Son for Executors of this my Last Will and Testament hereby also I do utterly disallow void and disannull all and every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies and Executors by me in any while before this time named Wills and Bequests Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament.

IN WITNESS Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

NOTE BEFORE SIGNED, The Testator intends current money in Pennsylvania wherever pounds or shillings are mentioned. Above signed sealed published pronounced and delivered by William Sharron to be his Last Will and Testament in Presence of us. Walter Buchannan, John McIntire, John Ervin and David Bell.

In primis its my Will that Margret my beloved wife have her saddle which she has bought since besides what is Bequeath to her within viz. on my Last will.

Item: It is my will that my eldest son Jmaes Sherran have all my apparel and body cloaths besides what is within Bequeathed to him excepting my best pair of Breeches which I allow to my Brother James.

Item: it is my will that my whole family be fed of the grain and other provisions made for that purpose till next Harvest and that the cattle be Wintered of the same.

Item: I order and allow my two youngest sons to have each of them a suit of cloaths of the cloaths that I have now with the fitter making lining and trimming to be paid with the debt already contracted by me. I still allow the crop on the ground to go with the place as for Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal. Witness Present Walter Buchannan and Arthur Forester.

In 1850 Caswell Hall Barnhill was living in the household of his brother and sister-in-law, Matthew and Nancy Barnhill. Caswell H. Barnhill married Sarah Jane McDoughon, Jan. 12, 1853 in Knoxville, Tennessee. The family moved to Greene County in about 1859 and took up residence in St. Francis Township. At this time their children were: George, 1855; and Ada Josephine, 1857. Both children were born in Tennessee. After the death of his first wife in 1868, Caswell H. Barnhill married Epsy Jane Jones, born in Bibb County, Alabama in 1841. Epsy was the daughter of Jonathan and Bethany Jones, both born in Alabama in 1820. The Jones family moved to Greene County in about 1857. The children of Caswell and Epsy Barnhill were: Arminta Elizabeth, 1861; Leer A., 1867; Sara J., 1869; William Caswell, 1872; Jonathan C., 1875; David K., 1877; and Joseph Hall, 1880. Arminta Barnhill married Thomas C. Spain, born in Tennessee in 1851. Their first child was named Ella, born in 1878. William Caswell Barnhill married Maud L. Kirby. They had three sons: Carl A., Floyd R., and Donald. Carl lives in Paragould on Barnhill Road near the former home of William C. and Maud Barnhill. Floyd Barnhill now lives in Jonesboro, Arkansas. Donald died in 1938. Jonathan C. Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, died when he was still a child. David Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, married Cora Dela Mae Johnson. Their children were: Ynonie, Gelette, George C., Larrabee Lawson, Beatrice Mae, and Helen. David Barnhill died in 1960 and Cora died in 1954. Both are buried at the Brown's Chapel Cemetery. Joseph Hall Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, married Virgie Ida Mae Spence. Their children were: Clarence F., Bertie Mae, Olive Marie, Woodrow Frederick, Charles Thomas, and Joseph Leonard. Joseph Hall Barnhill died in 1970 and his wife, Virgie, died in 1960. (Most of the information for this sketch was provided by Mr. Floyd R. Barnhill of Jonesboro, Arkansas.)

According to the "History of Bucks County, PA" by William H. Davis, Robert Barnhill, an early settler of Bedminster, is buried in the Deep Run Presbyterian Cemetery. Two of his sons, Samuel & John, married daughters of Daniel Craig, and a daughter married Archibald Finley, Jr., all of Bucks County. Robert Barnhill arrived from Ireland in 1734 at about the same time as the Finleys. Robert and his sons bought and sold several tracts of land. To a degree, they were "money loaners". Another son, William, was involved in tavernkeeping before moving to South Carolina. John later moved to Philadelphia becoming a merchant where he also established and operated a stage line known as the "Flying Machine". Samuel sold his lands in Bucks County, and purchased lands in Cumberland County where he lived several years before moving further west to Washington County. While it is not known when Robert died, it is believed that it was sometime in the mid to late 1760's. =====

That his exactual birthdate and birthplace were June 10, 1703, Baltimore, Maryland; and that the birthplace given by some as "County Antrim" was the ancestral home of his parents after the glorious rebellion against Catholicism byWilliam of Orange's forces in the battle of the Boyne River in Central Ireland in 1690." Researchers please note: This account is credible and plausible simply for the reason that this Robert Barnhill established himself in the printing business in Baltimore. Where better to learn the printing trade than from his own mother who brought a printing press from Ireland ?? Also please note Robert named his first son "John". This is in keeping with an apparent tradition among the Barnhills to name the first male child after the grandfather, and the second after the father or an uncle. This Robert Barnhill owned land on "Deep Run" Yeoman Co., Pa. in 1750. (see will of Thomas Stewart proved 22 March, 1750. (Daniel Craig was a neighbor)

## Barnhill Family History

The following is an overview of the Barnhill family. The original author of the article is unknown and the sources of the information were not stated. Therefore, you should read it with an open mind.

### THE BARNHILL FAMILY

Reprinted by Mrs. Ottis W. Ainsworth, who is a descendant of William Hodge Barnhill.

This family whose surname was originally written DeBarneval (becoming Barneval, Berneval, Barnewall, Barnewell, Barnehell, Barnehill, Barnihill, BARNhill and probably Bramhall) is the parent stock from which the ancient and noble houses of Trimblestown and Kingslad branched. As the original spelling (DeBarneval) implies, the name is of French extraction and the family was allied to the Dukes of Little-Bretagne, where the name still continues in great repute. It was first established in Ireland in 1172 by Sir Michael DeBerneval, one of the companions in arms of "Strongbow", Earl of Pembroke.

Sir Michael DeVerneval, or Berneval, the first settler of the family in Ireland, landed at Leinster in 1172. He is mentioned in the records of the Tower of London, as one of the Chief Captains of the expedition in 1172. He was succeeded by his son.

Alanus De Barneval, who received two marks as the King's gift for his expenses in going into Ireland, August 23rd, 1212 AD. The King's mandate sent to Geoffrey De Marisco directed that Hugh DeBerneval should have seisin of his land at Drumenagh and Terrenure in the vale of Dublin, December 12, 1216. He died, unmarried, sine procure, without issue and a mandate for seisin of his lands was granted to his brother and heir.

Reginald DeBerneval, who was restored to lands in Drumenagh and Terrenure, January 24, 1228, 1229. He had a grant November 27, 1233, of 20# Sterling a year, for his maintenance in the King's service (see mandate dated Sept. 28, 1234). He was succeeded by his son.

Ulphram of Wolfram De Berneval, or Drumenagh, who was constable of Dublin Castle in 1278, 1279, and 1281, and Sheriff of the Vale of Dublin in 1284 and 1289. He was a witness in 1289 to a deed between Hugh De Tyrell and the Prior and Convent of All Saints, near Dublin. He married Mary, the only daughter and heiress of Sir William Molyeux, Knight of Moylagh, County of Meathe, and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald DeVerneval, (note the change in spelling) of Drumenagh, who paid five shillings for Drumenagh, as subsidy to the King for the war against the Scots in 1299. He married a daughter of Sir Conway Clifford, Knight and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald DeVerneval, Jr. of Drumenagh. In 1309, he gave thirty shillings for the Army of Loxendy, and in 1313 he paid his services for the expedition to Castle Kryrening, under Piers Gaveston. He died in 1331, seised of a watermill, a dove-cote and profits of the Courts of Drumenagh and Terrenure, County Dublin, and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald DeBerneval, (the third) of Drumenagh, who contributed toward the expedition to Mallow, under Walter De Berminghame, in 1347 and in 1374 paid Royal Services for the Expedition to Kilkenny, under William de Windsor. He married Janetta, only daughter of Cusac of Killdeen, and left two sons.

a) Wolfram (or Ulphram) who succeeded to Drumenagh. He was living, seised of the Manor of Ballythermot, in 1400. His many descendants continued to reside at Drumenagh till the reign of Jas. I, when his line terminated in an heiress, Elizabeth, daughter of Marcus Barnewall (note that in less than two generations the name has changed three different times) of Drumenagh, who married a cousin, James Barnewall, of Bremare, and sold the property, Feb. 1st, 1607 to Sir Adam Loftus, Knight of Rathfarham.

b) Nicholas, ancestor of the baronets of Crickstown. His second son, Nicholas DeBerneval, of Crickstown, married a daughter of one Sir Clifford and had a son.

Sir Christopher De Berneval, of Crickstown, (the custody of 48 shillings rent issuing out of Lucy-Aniston, County Meath, held by Nicholas deBerneval, deceased of Roger, Earl of Ulster, the King's ward and in the King's hands by the minority of Christopher de Berneval, his son and heir, was granted to Richard Plumkett in April 1386); and married Eleanore, daughter of Sir Nicholas Rochford, Knight of Rath, County Meath, and by her had:

1. Christopher, his successor 2. John of Frandstown, Sheriff of Meath, 1435, 1436, ancestor of the Viscounts Kingslands, (see Bruke's Extinct and Dormant Peerage). 3. Barnaby, one of the Barons of the Exchequer. He died before 1384 and was succeeded by his eldest son,

Sir Christopher Barnewall (here in less than a generation the names have been changed twice), Knight of Crickstown, a minor at his father's death. Sir Christopher became Sergeant-at-law in 1408, Lord Treasurer of Ireland in 1436, and Chief Justice, marrying the daughter and heiress of the last Lord of Krykestown and Drakesrath, and left two sons:

1. Nicholas, his successor, and 2. Robert, high Lord Chancellor of Ireland, created March 4th, 1461, the Baron of Trimblestown. (See that title)

Sir Christopher was succeeded by his elder son,

Sir Nicholas Barnewall, (known in many passages in the records of the King's bench, as Barnehell) Knight of the law, was appointed, in consideration of his good and faithful services to the House of York, during the War of Roses, Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas, in Ireland for life, by patent dated August 1, 1461. He married Ismay, daughter and heiress of Sir Robert Serjeant, Knight of Castleknock, County Dublin, and had two sons:

1. Christopher, his successor and 2. Edmund, ancestor of the Barnewalls of Dunbrown.

We are left to speculate as to exactly what took place. We know that trouble of some nature developed between the Crown and the family of Sir Christopher Barnewall, but the exact nature has never been revealed. Sir Christopher and his family, evidently were disciplined by the King for some transgression. That Sir Christopher accepted the discipline and bowed in submission is indicated by the events which followed, namely that Sir Patrick, eldest son of Sir Christopher was knighted, and he (Sir Patrick) and his descendants continued in the Royal Service. We know, however, that the names shown above in capital letters followed by an \*did not bow in submission to the King's will and differed with their father, Sir Christopher, upon the advisability of accepting the discipline meted out to the family. The second, third, and fifth sons, Robert, John and James, were disinherited by their father, Sir Christopher and were branded as outlaws, and were exiled to Scotland where they took the surname Barnehell (becoming Barnehill, Barnihill, Barnhill). This happened about 1540, (actual date not established) Sir Walter Scott in his "Lay of the Last Minstrel" refers to the "Outlaw" Barnhill, as follows:

"On Minto crags the moonbeams glint, Where Barnhill hewed his bed offlint, Who flung his outlawed limbs to rest Where falcons hang their giddy nest."

An explanatory note to this verse says this Barnhills (plural) was a robber or outlaw. We also find in

---

the same explanatory note that the towers of the Easter (n) (Probably originally reading "eastern" Barnhills) were thrown down. (In English history we find the names of several men listed as outlaws who are listed in American History as "Patriots". These three brothers, Robert, John and James Barnehill, apparently were the first crusaders in the family for the cause of justice and gave their all for what they honestly believed to be just, right and true.

Prior to this division in the House of Barnewall, the Barnewall family had all embraced the Catholic religion. Robert, John and James denounced the Catholic faith as well as the Royal House of Stuart and embraced Presbyterianism which had then only begun to spread over the country. Later when the British Crown embraced Episcopalianism and attempted to force British subjects to accept the choice of the Crown, the Barnhills became active crusaders for Presbyterianism as opposed to Episcopalianism. They also supported William of Orange in his crusade in opposition to the move to join the British and Scottish Crowns and first returned to Ireland with William of Orange and participated in the Battle of the Boyne.

Descendants of Robert, John and James Barnehill are thought to have settled at what is now Barnhill, near Elgin, Scotland (research to establish this fact is now being carried on). Others moved to England and established the name Barnhill there. Those Barnhills who returned to Ireland under William of Orange settled in Counties Tyrone and Antrim, Ireland, and became fiery Orangemen. So bitter was their attacks on the British Crown that they were hunted and persecuted for years by agents of the British Government.

In 1689, there lived in Dublin, a young man by the name of John Barnhill, of Barnhill, who although a critic of the Government then in power, was not quite so outspoken as some other members of his family, and therefore had been permitted to live in comparative peace. He married Elizabeth---- (Surname unknown). A few years after his marriage, John Barnhill made a trip to London where he purchased type and other printing equipment and returned to Dublin where he built himself a printing press, making it out of Irish Oak. He and his wife, Elizabeth, who came from a family of high station and who was exceptionally well educated for one of that time, printed circulars and articles attacking the Royal House of Stuart, the proposal to join the Scotch and British Crowns and Episcopalianism as opposed to Presbyterianism, calling it English domination and religious intolerance. The Union Party of Britain, then in power, soon learned who printed these articles and set out to arrest John Barnhill. John, forewarned by friends and supporters, of this move after prearrangement with his wife, Elizabeth, hid himself in the hold of a ship bound for the American Colonies. The British authorities could not find John Barnhill but they could and did confiscate his property. Elizabeth and their sons, either three or four sons - it is possible that the fourth son was not yet born at the time of their persecution) fled to Scotland to take refuge from persecution, but first effectually hid the printing press so successfully that the Agents of the British Government never found it.

John Barnhill arrived in Baltimore in 1691. He immediately went to work and after several years accumulated enough money to bring his wife and family to the New World. They joined him here is possibly late 1690 but more probably early 1700. Elizabeth and their four sons bringing the printing press with them which they later set up in Baltimore where they printed articles telling of their persecution in Ireland which they sent back to Ireland for distribution.

John Barnhill kept a record of his family which he handed down to one of his sons who added to it and passed to his son. This grandson of John Barnhill, while visiting at home of a cousin in Pittsburgh in 1865, took sick and died of cholera and the records passed into the possession of this cousin, who, after the death of his first wife had married again. His second wife, one day in a rage and in an attempt to spite her step-sons, burned the records and accompanying papers. Thus perished the Barnhill records and the writings of our great-grandparents.

Prior to this catastrophe, Judge J.H. Barnhill of New Philadelphia, Ohio was visiting in the home of this Barnhill in Pittsburgh and saw and read these records. He described the writings of Elizabeth particularly as literary wonders, which showed exceptionally well, her wonderful education and refinement. When he learned of the destruction of the Barnhill records, the Judge reconstructed them as well as he could from memory, thus we have a skeleton form of the records today, though perhaps not entirely correct in all details.

Robert Barnhill, second Barnhill immigrant to the American Colonies, came from the northern part



---

of Ireland and arrived in Philadelphia, Sept. 28, 1734 (so says Mrs. Emma Dunn Mastin of Owensboro, KY). They settled in New Britain Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania. Family record follows: In this record is shown only the descendants of William Barnhill, who was the son of the immigrant Robert Barnhill above referred to, as to show all the descendants of Robert Barnhill would require too much space.

Samuel was still in Bucks County as late as 1768 as evidenced by a mortgage granted him by Jacob Guile (Gill) on Jun 18, 1768. He most likely remained there until the mid-1770's when he located for a period of time in Cumberland County before moving on to Washington County in 1779. He is found on the Washington Co., Pa. tax list of 1788. This reference could be to either Samuel or his eldest son, as there is a Samuel Barnhill on the 1787 tax list of Fayette County, Penn. Military: Post Rev War: Muster Rolls and Papers relating to the County of Washington. Pa. Archives, 1-Vol. II-6th Series, pp. 761-765. Served in Lieutenant Richard Seaton's company as private. Researcher David Lee Barnhill writes: "Fought in the Revolutionary War, removed to Washington County in Western Pennsylvania, and to Scott County, Kentucky with his son, Samuel Jr., cousins [this is an error] Robert Barnhill and Daniel Barnhill. He is list(ed) on the monument at Georgetown, KY" NOTE: This researcher believes the reference is to Samuel's son (also named Samuel) moved to Scott County, Kentucky about 1790 with two brothers, Robert and Daniel - based on historical documents regarding the early settlers of Scott County found in the Kentucky Historical Society's library at Frankfort. Hugh and Jane (nee Barnhill, the sister) Sharon moved from Washington County Pa. to Scott Co, KY a few years later. Also listed as a Washington County [Pennsylvania] Frontier Ranger 1778-1783. Bill Puttman, a Sharon researcher believes the Barnhill and Sharon families moved from Pennsylvania to Kentucky via the Ohio river, not overland, as some Barnhill researchers have previously stated. I agree with Puttman's analysis. A portion of his notes follow: "They remained in Fayette County, Kentucky only a short time and then moved to adjacent Scott County. Samuel Barnhill married Jean Craig, a sister of his brother's wife. They had four children; Robert, John, Alexander and James. Samuel acquired or inherited a portion of the New Britain homestead, but who in 1765, purchased a farm on the county line in Warrington. He sold both of these tracts, the homestead to Jacob Geil in 1768, and the Warrington farm by deed, dated December 1, 1766. Recorded in Deed Book 18, page 398. His wife Jean, joined in this deed. Robert Barnhill was the son of Samuel (1732 - 1794) and Jean (Craig) Barnhill (1734 - 1814). Samuel was the son of Robert Barnhill and Sarah Smith, Jean was the daughter of Daniel Craig and Margaret Bromfield.

Robert was born Feb. 28, 1769. Samuel and his family moved from Washington County, PA to Scott County Kentucky in 1789/1790.

Robert married Sarah Marvis, Feb. 8, 1791 and moved from Kentucky to Butler County, Ohio in 1805. On March 6, 1820 he and his family were in Marion County, IN. Their family was one of the first to settle in the area. Robert had applied for 10 - 80 acre tracts of the land opened up by the treaty between the Federal Government and the Indians of the area. There was an out break of the "plague" due to an extra heavy rainfall in the summer of 1821, and was spread by a house raising, with all of the men in the area assisting. Robert died on Sept. 9 and was buried with his son William and other plague victims in the "Plague Cemetery". This cemetery is said to have been about 150 feet southeast of Robert Barnhill's home at the time.

"The family of Robert Barnhill and his wife consisted of twelve [13] children, viz. : Samuel, John, William, Daniel, Robert, James, Hugh, Jane, Katie, Sally, Nancy, and Mary, - who became Mrs. Speer, and mother of William H. Speer, one of the most prominent citizens of the township. [missing Margaret]  
The widow of Robert Barnhill moved with her family (as before stated) to Wayne township soon after the death of her husband, and in 1829 she was assessed on eighty acres of land in the township, described as the southeast quarter of section 22, township 16, range 2.  
She married a second husband, Jacob Whiting. Her sons, Robert and Hugh Barnhill, are now living near the north line of the county."

Robert's will was the first to be entered for probate in Marion County. The will was filed June 4, 1822, Indiana State Archives.

"The Sharon Family History" - , pg 18,76-77

William was the first of this Sharon Lineage to arrive in America. From reading his will and from some guesswork, this was the William from Ayshire and Ulster referred to in Bancroft's Chronicles. William Putman, Jr. felt that there had to be a least a shred of truth in these old published works, but could not pin the line down until he found the actual old will in the basement archives of the Lancaster County Courthouse in Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

It is assumed that William Sherran was indeed of Scottish stock and that he, or more than likely his parents or Grandparents, Immigrated Ulster, Northern Ireland. Many of these people came to America for many reasons, most likely economic.

As William Sherran had grandchildren by the time he left his will in 1741, it is assumed that he was probably in his late fifties or sixties at that time. This would place his birth sometime in the 1680's and more than likely in Ulster, Ireland.

He was more than likely married about 1700 while living in Ireland and brought his young family over to America in the mid 1720's. By this time he would have been around forty and undoubtedly married. His will shows his wife to be Mary Sherran, maiden name unknown. Mary was still alive at the time of his death in early 1742.

William Sherran and his family probably arrived in the Port of Philadelphia around 1725 and it seems they headed immediately westward into what is now Lancaster County. This was very typical of the Scotch-Irish immigrants at the time.

His will indicates that he was a farmer all his life. This was, of course, the most common occupation of the early Scotch-Irish settlers in America, The only reason that they came to America was to be free in their Presbyterian religion and to obtain reasonably priced lands to farm and support their families.

William Sherran lived and died in Sadsbury township which is on the eastern border of Lancaster County. This was pretty much the western extent of Civilization in the 1720's and 1730's.

---

The will of William mentions his wife Mary who also signed and acknowledged the will. The will was witnessed by a John Sherran who was undoubtedly the surviving eldest son of his brother Thomas Sherran. This John was also living in Sadsbury on an adjacent farm.

The will lists his children who were: William this eldest; James and Hugh, his other two sons and his daughters, Gresall and Jean. He also mentions his son in law, Robert Line and granddaughters Martha & Margaret McCallpin. These last two mentions indicate that he had two other married daughters.

William Sherran wrote his will on May 13th, 1741 and it was proved on March 25th (New Year's Day) of 1742. He more than likely died sometime in the Month of March 1741/2. William Sherran junior was granted administration papers on March 25th, and was required to provide the court with an inventory of the state by April 25, 1742.

#### The Will of William Sherran 1741

The following will is taken from the Lancaster County Will Book A, Page 69. It is recorded under the name William Shennan, but again the actual writing shows it to be William Sherran. It is signed by both William and his wife Mary.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. May the 13th One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty one Anno Dom.

I William Sherran of Sadsbury township and County of Lancaster, farmer, being sick and weak of body but perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men once to dye. I do make and ordain this my last will and testament. That is to say I recommend my soul into the hand of God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors and as for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me in with I now dispose of and bequeath in the manner and form following and first of all I order that all my just and legal debts be paid and my funeral charges.

1. ITEM. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Mary Sherran one bay mare and her colt and one cow of a red and white colour with her calf also three sheep and a feather bead and be cloaths with seven pounds of money to be made out of estate to be paid her at the end and expiration of five years from this date.
2. ITEM. I give and bequeath unto to my son James Sherron three pounds to be paid at the expiration of four years from this date.
3. ITEM. I bequeath unto my son Hugh Sherran one young mare of two years old and one sheep and my boots and cloth for a big cote with seven pounds of money to be paid at the expiration of three years of this date.
4. ITEM. I bequeath to my daughter Gresall Sherran five shillings to be paid when demanded.
5. ITEM. I bequeath to my daughter Jean Sherran five shillings when demanded.
6. ITEM. I bequeath to my son in law Robert Line five shillings when demanded.
7. ITEM. I bequeath to my tow grand daughters Martha McCallpin and Margaret McCallpin twenty shillings to each of them to be paid at the expiration of six years and then I order my son William Sherran to the management of it to put it to the best advantage for their use until they come of age.
8. ITEM. I give and bequeath unto my son William Sherran all my rights and title of this Improvement whereon I now live with all my horses, cows and sheep and hogs with all the rest of my other movable good of every sort excepting what I bequeath and mentioned above and I order him that he truly pay or cause to be paid all the above written legacies according to the true intent and meaning of this my last will and testament and to pay all my just debts and funeral charges and I do constitute and appoint my well beloved so William Sherran to my whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament and I do revoke and disallow and disanull all other wills and

testaments made by me before the date hereof pronouncing and declaring this and no other to be my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal the day and year above written.

#### GENEALOGICAL SKETCHES

Barnhill The history of the Barnhill family begins with Robert Barnhill, a soldier in the American Revolution. He entered military service in about 1776 at Philadelphia. He took part in the battles of Long Island, New York, White Plains, Harlem, Morristown, Monmouth Courthouse, Trenton, and Princeton. After the Revolution he left Bucks County, Pennsylvania and went to Kentucky where he stayed for about two years. He next went to Mecklenburg County, North Carolina where he remained until his death on May 25, 1849. His children were: William, 1778; Margaret (Peggy), 1789; Rachel, 1793; John, 1795; Betsy, 1797; Mary, 1799; and Robert Jr., 1802. William Barnhill, son of Robert, married Elizabeth Connor in 1810. At some time prior to 1820 the family moved to Blount County, Tennessee. Their known children were: Matthew, 1824; and Caswell Hall, 1828. In 1850 Caswell Hall Barnhill was living in the household of his brother and sister-in-law, Matthew and Nancy Barnhill. Caswell H. Barnhill married Sarah Jane McDoughon, Jan. 12, 1853 in Knoxville, Tennessee. The family moved to Greene County in about 1859 and took up residence in St. Francis Township. At this time their children were: George, 1855; and Ada Josephine, 1857. Both children were born in Tennessee. After the death of his first wife in 1868, Caswell H. Barnhill married Epsy Jane Jones, born in Bibb County, Alabama in 1841. Epsy was the daughter of Jonathan and Bethany Jones, both born in Alabama in 1820. The Jones family moved to Greene County in about 1857. The children of Caswell and Epsy Barnhill were: Arminta Elizabeth, 1861; Leer A., 1867; Sara J., 1869; William Caswell, 1872; Jonathan C., 1875; David K., 1877; and Joseph Hall, 1880. Arminta Barnhill married Thomas C. Spain, born in Tennessee in 1851. Their first child was named Ella, born in 1878. William Caswell Barnhill married Maud L. Kirby. They had three sons: Carl A., Floyd R., and Donald. Carl lives in Paragould on Barnhill Road near the former home of William C. and Maud Barnhill. Floyd Barnhill now lives in Jonesboro, Arkansas. Donald died in 1938. Jonathan C. Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, died when he was still a child. David Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, married Cora Dela Mae Johnson. Their children were: Ynonie, Gelette, George C., Larrabee Lawson, Beatrice Mae, and Helen. David Barnhill died in 1960 and Cora died in 1954. Both are buried at the Brown's Chapel Cemetery. Joseph Hall Barnhill, son of Caswell and Epsy, married Virgie Ida Mae Spence. Their children were: Clarence F., Bertie Mae, Olive Marie, Woodrow Frederick, Charles Thomas, and Joseph Leonard. Joseph Hall Barnhill died in 1970 and his wife, Virgie, died in 1960. (Most of the information for this sketch was provided by Mr. Floyd R. Barnhill of Jonesboro, Arkansas.)

According to the "History of Bucks County, PA" by William H. Davis, Robert Barnhill, an early settler of Bedminster, is buried in the Deep Run Presbyterian Cemetery. Two of his sons, Samuel & John, married daughters of Daniel Craig, and a daughter married Archibald Finley, Jr., all of Bucks County. Robert Barnhill arrived from Ireland in 1734 at about the same time as the Finleys. Robert and his sons bought and sold several tracts of land. To a degree, they were "money loaners". Another son, William, was involved in tavernkeeping before moving to South Carolina. John later moved to Philadelphia becoming a merchant where he also established and operated a stage line known as the "Flying Machine". Samuel sold his lands in Bucks County, and purchased lands in Cumberland County where he lived several years before moving further west to Washington County. While it is not known when Robert died, it is believed that it was sometime in the mid to late 1760's. =====

in Central Ireland in 1690." Researchers please note: This account is credible and plausible simply for the reason that this Robert Barnhill established himself in the printing business in Baltimore. Where better to learn the printing trade than from his own mother who brought a printing press from Ireland ?? Also please note Robert named his first son "John". This is in keeping with an apparent tradition among the Barnhills to name the first male child after the grandfather, and the second after the father or an uncle. This Robert Barnhill owned land on "Deep Run" Yeoman Co., Pa. in 1750. (see will of Thomas Stewart proved 22 March, 1750. (Daniel Craig was a neighbor)

#### Barnhill Family History

The following is an overview of the Barnhill family. The original author of the article is unknown and the sources of the information were not stated. Therefore, you should read it with an open mind.

#### THE BARNHILL FAMILY

Reprinted by Mrs. Ottis W. Ainsworth, who is a descendant of William Hodge Barnhill.

This family whose surname was originally written DeBarneval (becoming Barneval, Berneval, Barnewall, Barnewell, Barnehell, Barnehill, Barnihill, BARNhill and probably Bramhall) is the parent stock from which the ancient and noble houses of Trimblestown and Kingslad branched. As the original spelling (DeBarneval) implies, the name is of French extraction and the family was allied to the Dukes of Little-Bretagne, where the name still continues in great repute. It was first established in Ireland in 1172 by Sir Michael DeBerneval, one of the companions in arms of "Strongbow", Earl of Pembroke.

Sir Michael DeVerneval, or Berneval, the first settler of the family in Ireland, landed at Leinster in 1172. He is mentioned in the records of the Tower of London, as one of the Chief Captains of the expedition in 1172. He was succeeded by his son.

Alanus De Barneval, who received two marks as the King's gift for his expenses in going into Ireland, August 23rd, 1212 AD. The King's mandate sent to Geoffrey De Marisco directed that Hugh DeBerneval should have seisin of his land at Drummenagh and Terrenure in the vale of Dublin, December 12, 1216. He died, unmarried, sine procure, without issue and a mandate for seisin of his lands was granted to his brother and heir.

Reginald DeBerneval, who was restored to lands in Drummenagh and Terrenure, January 24, 1228, 1229. He had a grant November 27, 1233, of 20# Sterling a year, for his maintenance in the King's service (see mandate dated Sept. 28, 1234). He was succeeded by his son.

Ulphram of Wolfram De Berneval, or Drummenagh, who was constable of Dublin Castle in 1278, 1279, and 1281, and Sheriff of the Vale of Dublin in 1284 and 1289. He was a witness in 1289 to a deed between Hugh De Tyrell and the Prior and Convent of All Saints, near Dublin. He married

---

Mary, the only daughter and heiress of Sir William Molyeux, Knight of Moylagh, County of Meathe, and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald Deverneval, (note the change in spelling) of Drumenagh, who paid five shillings for Drumenagh, as subsidy to the King for the war against the Scots in 1299. He married a daughter of Sir Conway Clifford, Knight and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald Deverneval, Jr. of Drumenagh. In 1309, he gave thirty shillings for the Army of Loxendy, and in 1313 he paid his services for the expedition to Castle Kryrening, under Piers Gaveston. He died in 1331, seised of a watermill, a dove-cote and profits of the Courts of Drumenagh and Terrenure, County Dublin, and was succeeded by his son.

Reginald DeBerneval, (the third) of Drumenagh, who contributed toward the expedition to Mollow, under Walter De Berminghame, in 1347 and in 1374 paid Royal Services for the Expedition to Kilkenny, under William de Windsor. He married Janetta, only daughter of Cusac of Killdeen, and left two sons.

a) Wolfram (or Ulphram) who succeeded to Drumenagh. He was living, seised of the Manor of Ballythermot, in 1400. His many descendants continued to reside at Drumenagh till the reign of Jas. I, when his line terminated in an heiress, Elizabeth, daughter of Marcus Barnewall (note that in less than two generations the name has changed three different times) of Drumenagh, who married a cousin, James Barnewall, of Bremare, and sold the property, Feb. 1st, 1607 to Sir Adam Loftus, Knight of Rathera Farmham.

b) Nicholas, ancestor of the baronets of Crickstown. His second son, Nicholas DeBerneval, of Crickstown, married a daughter of one Sir Clifford and had a son.

Sir Christopher De Berneval, of Crickstown, (the custody of 48 shillings rent issuing out of Lucy-Aniston, County Meathe, held by Nicholas deBerneval, deceased of Roger, Earl of Ulster, the King's ward and in the King's hands by the minority of Christopher de Berneval, his son and heir, was granted to Richard Plumkett in April 1386); and married Eleanore, daughter of Sir Nicholas Rochford, Knight of Rath, Coffee County, Kildare and Kilbride, County Meathe, and by her had:

1. Christopher, his successor 2. John of Frandstown, Sheriff of Meathe, 1435, 1436, ancestor of the Viscounts Kingslands, (see Bruke's Extinct and Dormant Peerage). 3. Barnaby, one of the Barons of the Exchequer. He died before 1384 and was succeeded by his eldest son,

Sir Christopher Barnewall (here in less than a generation the names have been changed twice), Knight of Crickstown, a minor at his father's death. Sir Christopher became Sergeant-at-law in 1408, Lord Treasurer of Ireland in 1436, and Chief Drake, marrying the daughter and heiress of the last Lord of Krykestown and Drakesrath, and left two sons:

1. Nicholas, his successor, and 2. Robert, high Lord Chancellor of Ireland, created March 4th, 1461, the Baron of Trimblestown. (See that title)

Sir Christopher was succeeded by his elder son,

Sir Nicholas Barnewall, (known in many passages in the records of the King's bench, as Barnehell) Knight of the law, was appointed, in consideration of his good and faithful services to the House of York, during the War of Roses, Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas, in Ireland for life, by patent dated August 1, 1461. He married Ismay, daughter and heiress of Sir Robert Serjeant, Knight of Castleknock, County Dublin, and had two sons:

1. Christopher, his successor and 2. Edmund, ancestor of the Barnewalls of Dunbrown.

We are left to speculate as to exactly what took place. We know that trouble of some nature developed between the Crown and the family of Sir Christopher Barnewall, but the exact nature has never been revealed. Sir Christopher and his family, evidently were disciplined by the King for some transgression. That Sir Christopher accepted the discipline and bowed in submission is indicated by the events which followed, namely that Sir Patrick, eldest son of Sir Christopher was knighted, and he (Sir Patrick) and his descendants continued in the Royal Service. We know, however, that the

---

names shown above in capital letters followed by an \*did not bow in submission to the King's will and differed with their father, Sir Christopher, upon the advisability of accepting the discipline meted out to the family. The second, third, and fifth sons, Robert, John and James, were disowned and disinherited by their father, Sir Christopher and were branded as outlaws, and were exiled to Scotland where they took the surname Barnehell (becoming Barnehill, Barnihill, Barnhill). This happened about 1540, (actual date not established) Sir Walter Scott in his "Lay of the Last Minstrel" refers to the "Outlaw" Barnhill, as follows:

"On Minto crags the moonbeams glint, Where Barnhill hewed his bed offlint, Who flung his outlawed limbs to rest Where falcons hang their giddy nest."

An explanatory note to this verse says this Barnhills (plural) was a robber or outlaw. We also find in the same explanatory note that the towers of the Easter (n) (Probably originally reading "eastern" Barnhills) were thrown down. (In English history we find the names of several men listed as outlaws who are listed in American History as "Patriots". These three brothers, Robert, John and James Barnehell, apparently were the first crusaders in the family for the cause of justice and gave their all for what they honestly believed to be just, right and true.

Prior to this division in the House of Barnewall, the Barnewall family had all embraced the Catholic religion. Robert, John and James denounced the Catholic faith as well as the Royal House of Stuart and embraced Presbyterianism which had then only begun to spread over the country. Later when the British Crown embraced Episcopalianism and attempted to force British subjects to accept the choice of the Crown, the Barnhills became active crusaders for Presbyterianism as opposed to Episcopalianism. They also supported William of Orange in his crusade in opposition to the move to join the British and Scottish Crowns and first returned to Ireland with William of Orange and participated in the Battle of the Boyne.

Descendants of Robert, John and James Barnehill are thought to have settled at what is now Barnhill, near Elgin, Scotland (research to establish this fact is now being carried on). Others moved to England and established the name Barnhill there. Those Barnhills who returned to Ireland under William of Orange settled in Counties Tyrone and Antrim, Ireland, and became fiery Orangemen. So bitter was their attacks on the British Crown that they were hunted and persecuted for years by agents of the British Government.

In 1689, there lived in Dublin, a young man by the name of John Barnhill, of Barnihill, who although a critic of the Government then in power, was not quite so outspoken as some other members of his family, and therefore had been permitted to live in comparative peace. He married Elizabeth---- (Surname unknown). A few years after his marriage, John Barnhill made a trip to London where he purchased type and other printing equipment and returned to Dublin where he built himself a printing press, making it out of Irish Oak. He and his wife, Elizabeth, who came from a family of high station and who was exceptionally well educated for one of that time, printed circulars and articles attacking the Royal House of Stuart, the proposal to join the Scotch and British Crowns and Episcopalianism as opposed to Presbyterianism, calling it English domination and religious intolerance. The Union Party of Britain, then in power, soon learned who printed these articles and set out to arrest John Barnhill. John, forewarned by friends and supporters, of this move after prearrangement with his wife, Elizabeth, hid himself in the hold of a ship bound for the American Colonies. The British authorities could not find John Barnhill but they could and did confiscate his property. Elizabeth and their sons, either three or four sons - it is possible that the fourth son was not yet born at the time of their persecution) fled to Scotland to take refuge from persecution, but first effectually hid the printing press so successfully that the Agents of the British Government never found it.

John Barnhill arrived in Baltimore in 1691. He immediately went to work and after several years accumulated enough money to bring his wife and family to the New World. They joined him here is possibly late 1600 but more probably early 1700. Elizabeth and their four sons bringing the printing press with them which they later set up in Baltimore where they printed articles telling of their persecution in Ireland which they sent back to Ireland for distribution.

John Barnhill kept a record of his family which he handed down to one of his sons who added to it and passed to his son. This grandson of John Barnhill, while visiting at home of a cousin in Pittsburgh in 1865, took sick and died of cholera and the records passed into the possession of this

---

cousin, who, after the death of his first wife had married again. His second wife, one day in a rage and in an attempt to spite her step-sons, burned the records and accompanying papers. Thus perished the Barnhill records and the writings of our great-grandparents.

Prior to this catastrophe, Judge J.H. Barnhill of New Philadelphia, Ohio was visiting in the home of this Barnhill in Pittsburgh and saw and read these records. He described the writings of Elizabeth particularly as literary wonders, which showed exceptionally well, her wonderful education and refinement. When he learned of the destruction of the Barnhill records, the Judge reconstructed them as well as he could from memory, thus we have a skeleton form of the records today, though perhaps not entirely correct in all details.

Robert Barnhill, second Barnhill immigrant to the American Colonies, came from the northern part of Ireland and arrived in Philadelphia, Sept. 28, 1734 (so says Mrs. Emma Dunn Mastin of Owensboro, KY). They settled in New Britain Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania. Family record follows: In this record is shown only the descendants of William Barnhill, who was the son of the immigrant Robert Barnhill above referred to, as to show all the descendants of Robert Barnhill would require too much space.

From what William Brynes Putman, Jr. was able to determine through old wills and tax records, there were two brothers, William Sherran and Thomas Sherran, who came together from Ulster to Philadelphia in the early to mid 1720's. They made what arrangements were necessary for lands in the new country and moved to the Township of Sadsbury in what was then Chester County, Pennsylvania.

It is interesting to note that the eldest sons of both Thomas and William Sherran were named John. It was very common to name the first male after the father's father. If this is the case, then the father of these two men was John Sherran. Theres is no record of John, the father, coming to America with his sons, but it does give us a name to try and trace back in Ulster.

- 192. i. William Sharon was born about 1675 in Ayshire, Scotland. He died on 20 Mar 1742 in Sadbury Twp., Lancaster Co., PA. He married Mary ?.

Thomas Sherran appears to be a married taxpayer as early as 1727 in Sadsbury township of what was then Chester County, Pennsylvania. The rest of what is known is from the wills these two brothers left. Thomas' in 1737 and William's in 1741.

Both these wills were found in the very early records of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Lancaster was formed as a county in 1729 and Sadsbury township was then included in this new county.



---

The will of Thomas Sherran made no mention of William or his children, nor did William's make any reference to Thomas' family. There it is believed they were brothers rather than any father and son relationship.

Thomas Sherran (or sometimes spelled Thomas Sharran) was a farmer who spent the remainder of his life after reaching America in Sadsbury Township of Lancaster County.

He wrote his will on April 4th, 1737 and must have died shortly afterwards as the will was proved in court on April 27th of the same year. The will was witnessed by William McClure, Samuel Irwin and Margaret Carnachan. The McClures were to go with William Sherran to Pennsborough in Cumberland County in the 1740's.

Thomas Sherran's will indicated that his wife, Agness Sherran was still alive. Maiden name unknown. He also listed his children. His eldest son, John Sherran was to receive half of his farm and his son Samuel was to receive the other half when he came of age.

This indicated that Samuel was still under the age of sixteen in 1737. The will also mentions two daughters; Anna who was under the age of sixteen and her older sister Margaret who was married to a Thomas at the time. The will also mentions his youngest son Thomas.

It seems that all of Thomas Sherran's sons remained in Chester County at least through the Revolution. Records are spotty, but they pop up through the 1750's 1760 and in the Lancaster Militia during the Revolution.

#### The Will of Thomas Sharran 1737

The following will is recorded in the Lancaster County, Pennsylvania Will Book A, Page 26. It is listed as being the will of Thomas Shannan, but from the writing it is obviously Thomas Sharran, The will was proved in Lancaster Court on April 27, 1737.

APRIL ye, fourth in the Name of God Amen, Anno Domm. One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty Seven. I Thomas Sharran of Sadsbury Township and County of Lancaster, Farmer, being sick and weak of body but of perfit mind and memory thanks be given unto God, therefore call into mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men once to die I do now make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say I recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that gave it And my Body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executes. An as for Such Worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with I now dispose and bequeath in manner and form following.

ITEM. FIRST of I Order that all my just and lawful debts be pay'd and my funeral charges.

ITEM> I give and bequeath unto my son John Sharran one half of the place where I now live and the other half I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Sharran to be equally divided between them and I order my well beloved wife Agness Sharran shall be maintained out of the half that give to my son Samuel while she lives and my other three children Viz. Margaret Thomas and Anna Sharran are to be maintained out of the same until they come of age.

ITEM. I give and bequeath unto each of my two daughters fiteens pounds to be raised out of my movable estate and paid unto the eldest at the expiration of two years and to be paid to the other when she comes of age.

ITEM> I give and bequeath unto to my son Thomas Sharran fifteen pounds to be

raised likewise out of my movable estate to be paid when he comes of age together with his loom and tacklin and I do constitute and appoint my well beloved son John Sharran and my trusty friend Samuel Irwin to be my sole executts. of this my Last Will and Testament and I do revolk disallow and disannul all other wills and testament made by me be the date herof pronouncing and declaring this and no other to be my last will and testament as witness my hand the and year above writn.
